As we draw the first term of 2025 to a close, I would like to take this opportunity to reflect on what has been a dynamic and rewarding start to the year. With our core values of academic excellence, discipline, and holistic development guiding us, it has been heartening to witness our learners thriving in all spheres of school life.

This year, we have adopted the theme **"Make a Difference"**, which encapsulates our commitment to empowering our learners to become active, compassionate, and responsible members of both the Selborne College community and the broader society. Whether it is through academic excellence, sports, arts, or community service, we are encouraging our learners to find ways to contribute meaningfully and positively.

"Make a Difference" is not only about striving for personal excellence but also about considering how each action, no matter how small, can impact those around us. It is a call to inspire leadership, responsibility, and empathy—values we hold dear at Selborne College.

STAFF

We warmly welcomed our staff back at the start of Term 1 and kicked off 2025 with a Staff Development session by Bizskills. This session provided valuable insights and set a positive tone for the year ahead. We are also pleased to introduce new staff members to our school: Mrs Gumunyu in the Geography Department, Mr Boshoff (Class of 2019) in the English Department, and Mr Deere (Class of 2024), who joins us as a Learnership. We look forward to their contributions and wish them all the best in their roles.

ACADEMIC

Our academic year began with an emphasis on establishing strong foundations. Our teachers have worked tirelessly to engage learners in a stimulating learning environment. We have attempted to protect the contact time for the learners, and our staff, this term by not having learners or staff away from school unnecessarily. I am pleased to report that we have seen notable progress, across all grades, and our learners are engaging with their studies with enthusiasm and dedication.

SUMMARY OF TERM 1 RESULTS

We are proud to share that our school currently has a total of 772 learners. Among them, we have: 165 Top Achievers (earning 4 distinctions or more), including 43 in Grade 12, 16 in Grade 11, 21 in Grade 10, 55 in Grade 9, and 30 in Grade 8.

Additionally, no fewer than 41% of our students have earned a place on the Merit List (with an overall aggregate of 70% or higher). 88% of our Grade 10–12 learners have achieved a Bachelor's Pass, with 89% of the Grade 12 class attaining this level. Furthermore, 30% of all subject achievements across Grade 8–12 (9 subjects in Grades 8 and 9, 6 subjects in Grades 10, 11 and 12) are distinctions.

This is an excellent start to the year, and we strongly encourage and motivate our boys to maintain this momentum and ensure that their academic results remain a priority.

We initiated a pilot project in Grade 9 this year, where a class was provided with access to academic resources via tablets. This project, in collaboration with Oden Education, an Ed-Tech company based in South Africa, aims to assess whether the integration of technology and digital resources will positively influence learner outcomes. We are grateful for the opportunity to explore this innovative approach to enhancing learning and are eager to evaluate its impact on academic performance.

CULTURE & SOCIETIES

Our cultural calendar has been filled with events celebrating creativity and talent. The Drama Club's production, the Music ensemble and Art have provided our learners with the opportunity to showcase their talents. These activities are a vital part of the Selborne College experience, nurturing well-rounded individuals who contribute to our school's rich legacy. Our learners have been actively involved in a variety of inspiring events, including the SCA Praise and Worship Evening, Cultural Week, ongoing work in our gardens, and Music in the Park. Cultural Week was a tremendous success, and the Guitar Evening truly stood out as a highlight. We look forward to even more exciting moments ahead!

At the Interhouse Play Evening, the production of *Isaiah* was awarded first place. Ronald Theron, who served as both the producer and director, was also honoured with the title of Best Actor. This outstanding production will be showcased at the ATKV later this year.

SPORT

Selborne College continues to excel in sporting activities, and Term 1 has been no exception. Our sports teams have demonstrated grit and determination in their fixtures, showing great sportsmanship and a commitment to excellence. A few highlights include:

- Athletics At the EC Champs, Luvo Xokiyana was 1st in High Jump and Triple Jump (U19), Jonathan Cronje was 1st in High Jump (U17), both learners have been included in the EC Team to participate at the National Champs.
- Chess Tyler Botha and Samuel Chang have been selected for EC Team to participate in the SA U16 Junior Closed Champs
- Cricket Unfortunately lost in the SA 20 Semi-Final
- Golf Kyle van der Bergh won the EL Men's Open Tournament, Aaron Louw lost in the ¼ Final of SA Amateur Men's Championship and Selborne College won the Selborne Golf Festival. Ben Weber won Best Player, who received a re-award of his Honours Award at Quarterly Awards.
- Rowing The Club qualified for 12 finals at the Buffalo/Selborne Regatta and at SA Schools Champs, 2 crews qualified for finals.


